The average attendance of the colored children is 4,222 and of the white 21,523. The educational facilities are very little better than they were ten years ago. The colored people support many schools of their own and in many cases supplement the school term by three or four months. The city is doing very little toward bettering conditions of Negro education. Were it not for the denominational and private schools the educational facilities for Negro children would be meagre indeed. Sabine County: There are 27 colored and 80 white schools. The term of the colored schools is from three to six months and of the white from four to eight months. Both the white and colored schools have eleven grades. There are about 41...



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
